

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE **COLLECTION EVENT - JANUARY 6**


Bring your household hazardous waste to the Service Center (2001 Precinct Line Rd.) on January 6, 2024, from 8-11 a.m., along with an ID and Hurst water bill. For a list of items accepted, visit hurstx.gov/calendar.

Document shredding will be available. Three (3) box limit, no larger than 15" x 12" x 10" accepted. Limited space. First come, first served.

6 Stones will be on-site accepting clothing donations from Hurst residents.

GREASE ROUNDUP

This holiday season, we're making it easier than ever to Cease the Grease! The City of Hurst encourages residents to collect and recycle or safely dispose of all used fats, oils and grease. When these items are washed down the drain, it sticks inside pipes. This hardening eventually leads to build up that clogs and damages the sanitary sewer system.

You can recycle your grease for FREE at our drop off location at the north end of the Service Center parking lot at 2001 Precinct Line Road through **January 5**, **2024**.

CODERED EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION

The City of Hurst uses the CodeRED Emergency Notification System to notify the entire city or only the affected areas, via telephone or cell phone, about emergency situations in a matter of minutes. The system is available to all Hurst residents free of charge. These phone calls will begin with "This is a CodeRed Emergency message from The City of Hurst."

In what case would I receive a CodeRED message?

- Homeland Security related emergencies
- Hazardous material emergencies
- Drinking water contamination
- Other emergency situations where rapid and accurate notification is essential for life safety
- Missing persons report
- Warning of significant weather

What should I do if I receive a CodeRED message?

- Listen to the entire message carefully, and follow the instructions
- DO NOT call 9-1-1 unless instructed to do so.
