Executive Director of Planning and Development Michelle Lazo briefed Council on the SITE-2022-00012 Archway Industrial, a site plan approval for Tract 2A3A Gulaver Wilson Survey A-1626, being 8.30 acres located at 615 W. Hurst Boulevard noting the request to construct a new office warehouse facility with flexible lease space and truck loading docks. She stated the warehouse will be 127,345 square feet, with lease space of 9,350 square feet. She reviewed parking and noted the applicant and engineering staff are working with the Texas Department of Transportation (TXDOT) for approval of a median opening and two driveways on West Hurst Boulevard including sidewalks on Highway 10. Ms. Lazo reviewed landscape plans, lighting plans, elevation and signage request for tenant signs on the west elevation and a multi-tenant monument sign. Also noted, the applicant is working with engineering staff, prior to platting, on floodway plans.

Background/Analysis:

An application has been made by Clay Christy with Clay Moore Engineering, for a Site Plan on Tract 2A3A Gulaver Wilson Survey A-1626, being 8.30 acres located at 615 W. Hurst Boulevard. The property is zoned TX-10 PD (Texas Hwy 10 Multi Use).

The developer is requesting the site plan to construct a new office warehouse facility with flexible lease space and truck loading docks. The proposed warehouse will be 127,345 square feet, with lease spaces of 9,350 sq. ft. The space will be flexible based on tenant needs. The proposed development will have parking on the north and east side of the building and a truck bay area on the west side of the property. They are working with the City and TXDOT on approval of a median opening and two driveways on West Hurst Boulevard.

There is a large natural wooded buffer area to the east owned by Gardner Capital. This area is platted as a separate lot and will remain as a buffer to the industrial uses to the west. The building will have wall packs on the building for exterior lighting, but will maintain zero foot-candles at the property line.

The applicant plans to preserve existing tree canopy around the perimeter of the site and will enhance the front of the property adding nine (9) Texas Red Oak, three (3) Cedar Elm, Dwarf Yaupon Holly, Pink Muhly, and Bermuda sod.

The building elevation indicates a khaki and beige concrete tilt wall construction with metal accent coated panels around the perimeter. The east elevation will have

small storefront glass windows, the west elevation will have storefront office doors and windows with large metal bay doors.

They are requesting a building sign on the front elevation and tenant signs on the west elevation. These signs will meet the sign requirements for TX-10 zoning. They are also requesting a multi-tenant monument sign that is 12 ft. in height with a maximum of 120 sq. ft. per face.

Funding Sources and Community Sustainability:

There is no fiscal impact.

Consideration of the Site Plan is a direct representation of Council's goal for **Economic Vitality**.

Recommendation:

Based on the Planning and Zoning Commission's vote of 5-0, the recommendation is City Council move to approve Ordinance 2527, second reading, a Site Plan for Archway Industrial.

- **WHEREAS,** the City Council is of the opinion that the site plan herein effectuated furthers the purpose of zoning as set forth in the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance and is in the best interest of the citizens of the City of Hurst.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HURST, TEXAS:

Section 1. **THAT** the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance of the City of Hurst is hereby amended by adopting a site plan with Exhibits "A-F" for Tract 2A3A Gulaver Wilson Survey A-1626, being 8.30 acres located at 615 W. Hurst Blvd.





- GRADES TO BE ESTABLISHED. ENSURE THAT THE FINISH GRADE IN SHRUB AREAS IMMEDIATELY ADJACENT TO WALKS AND OTHER WALKING SURFACES, AFTER INSTALLING SOIL AMENDMENTS, IS 3" BELOW THE ADJACENT FINISH SURFACE. IN ORDER TO ALLOW FOR PROPER MULCH DEPTH. TAPER THE SOIL SURFACE TO MEET FINISH GRADE. AS SPECIFIED ON THE GRADING PLANS. AT APPROXIMATELY 18" AWAY FROM THE WALKS
- e. ENSURE THAT THE FINISH GRADE IN TURF AREAS IMMEDIATELY ADJACENT TO WALKS AND OTHER WALKING SURFACES, AFTER INSTALLING SOIL AMENDMENTS, IS 1" BELOW THE FINISH SURFACE OF THE WALKS. - SHOULD ANY CONFLICTS AND/OR DISCREPANCIES ARISE BETWEEN THE GRADING PLANS. GEOTECHNICAL REPORT, THESE NOTES AND PLANS, AND ACTUAL CONDITIONS, THE CONTRACTOR SHALL IMMEDIATELY BRING SUCH ITEMS TO THE ATTENTION OF THE LANDSCAPE ARCHITECT, GENERAL CONTRACTOR, AND OWNER.
- ONCE SOIL PREPARATION IS COMPLETE, THE LANDSCAPE CONTRACTOR SHALL ENSURE THAT THERE ARE NO DEBRIS, TRASH, OR STONES LARGER THAN 1" REMAINING IN THE TOP 6" OF SOIL.



- APPROPRIATE). SUBMITTALS SHALL ALSO INCLUDE MANUFACTURER CUT SHEETS FOR PLANTING ACCESSORIES SUCH
- AS TREE STAKES AND TIES, EDGING, AND LANDSCAPE FABRICS (IF ANY) WHERE MULTIPLE ITEMS ARE SHOWN ON A PAGE, THE CONTRACTOR SHALL CLEARLY INDICATE THE ITEM BEING CONSIDERED.
- GENERAL PLANTING REMOVE ALL NURSERY TAGS AND STAKES FROM PLANTS.
- EXCEPT IN AREAS TO BE PLANTED WITH ORNAMENTAL GRASSES, APPLY PRE-EMERGENT HERBICIDES AT THE MANUFACTURER'S RECOMMENDED RATE.
- TRENCHING NEAR EXISTING TREES: CONTRACTOR SHALL NOT DISTURB ROOTS 1-1/2" AND LARGER IN DIAMETER WITHIN THE CRITICAL ROOT ZONE (CRZ) OF EXISTING TREES, AND SHALL EXERCISE ALL POSSIBLE CARE AND PRECAUTIONS TO AVOID INJURY TO TREE ROOTS, TRUNKS, AND BRANCHES. THE CRZ IS DEFINED AS A CIRCULAR AREA EXTENDING OUTWARD FROM THE TREE TRUNK. WITH A RADIUS EQUAL TO 1' FOR EVERY 1" OF TRUNK DIAMETER-AT-BREAST-HEIGHT (4.5' ABOVE THE AVERAGE
- ALL EXCAVATION WITHIN THE CRZ SHALL BE PERFORMED USING HAND TOOLS. NO MACHINE EXCAVATION OR TRENCHING OF ANY KIND SHALL BE ALLOWED WITHIN THE CRZ.
- ALTER ALIGNMENT OF PIPE TO AVOID TREE ROOTS 1-1/2" AND LARGER IN DIAMETER. WHERE TREE ROOTS 1-1/2" AND LARGER IN DIAMETER ARE ENCOUNTERED IN THE FIELD, TUNNEL UNDER SUCH ROOTS. - ROLL THE SOD TO ENSURE GOOD CONTACT OF THE SOD'S ROOT SYSTEM WITH THE SOIL WATER THE SOD THOROUGHLY WITH A FINE SPRAY IMMEDIATELY AFTER PLANTING TO OBTAIN AT
- LEAST SIX INCHES OF PENETRATION INTO THE SOIL BELOW THE SOD. G. HYDROMULCHING TURF HYDROMULCH MIX (PER 1,000 SF) SHALL BE AS FOLLOWS:
 - a. WINTER MIX (OCTOBER 1 MARCH 31)
 - 50# CELLULOSE FIBER MULCH 2# UNHULLED BERMUDA SEED
 - 2# ANNUAL RYE SEED
 - 15# 15-15-15 WATER SOLUBLE FERTILIZER SUMMER MIX (APRIL 1 - SEPTEMBER 30) 50# CELLULOSE FIBER MULCH
 - 2# HULLED BERMUDA SEED 15# 15-15-15 WATER SOLUBLE FERTILIZER SEED HYDROMULCH MIX (PER 1,000 SF) SHALL BE AS FOLLOWS:
 - 50# CELLULOSE FIBER MULCH
- 15# 15-15-15 WATER SOLUBLE FERTILIZER SEED RATE PER LEGEND
- INSTALL MULCH TOPDRESSING, TYPE AND DEPTH PER MULCH NOTE, IN ALL PLANTING AREAS AND
- DO NOT INSTALL MULCH WITHIN 6" OF TREE ROOT FLARE AND WITHIN 24" OF HABITABLE STRUCTURES, EXCEPT AS MAY BE NOTED ON THESE PLANS. MULCH COVER WITHIN 6" OF CONCRETE WALKS AND CURBS SHALL NOT PROTRUDE ABOVE THE FINISH SURFACE OF THE WALKS AND CURBS. MULCH COVER WITHIN 12" OF WALLS SHALL BE AT LEAST 3" LOWER THAN THE TOP OF WALL.



Background/Analysis:

The Fleet Services Division is committed to maintaining, repairing, and replacing City vehicles and equipment in a timely and cost-effective manner to prevent interruptions in City services. The Fleet Services Division follows a replacement schedule to determine vehicle and equipment depreciation and estimate service life. During the vehicle's or equipment's service life, all parts, fuel, and repairs are tracked. Each year, during the budget process, all vehicles and equipment are evaluated based on age, mileage, maintenance, and repair costs. Following this evaluation process, the necessary vehicles and equipment are budgeted to be replaced in the upcoming fiscal year. After vehicles are approved for replacement, Fleet Services staff examine them to determine if any equipment can be reused in an effort to lower costs.

Due to supply chain issues, staff could not replace vehicles in Fiscal Year (FY) 2022 and is attempting to catch up on purchases this year. For FY 2022 and FY 2023, the following vehicles and equipment are scheduled and budgeted for replacement: seven (7) Chevrolet Tahoe PPV Police Patrol vehicles, two (2) Chevrolet Equinox for Police COP vehicles, two (2) Chevrolet C-1500 trucks for Parks and Water Departments, one (1) Chevrolet C-2500 truck for Animal Services and one (1) K-5500 with service body for Fleet Services.

The City of Hurst is a member of several purchasing consortiums, which provide substantial cost savings for purchasing vehicles and equipment. When making purchases through these contracts, the City can purchase directly from the vendor as low bidders. The total budget for the purchase of these units is \$591,000. The remaining budgeted funds after purchase will be used to install the necessary equipment, after examinations, to determine what can be reused from the existing units. This equipment and vehicle decaling will be purchased following City standard purchasing policies and procedures.

Funding Sources and Community Sustainability:

Funding for these units has been identified within the FY 2022 and FY 2023 Fleet Service Fund and Water Enterprise Fund.

The fleet replacement schedule is designed to be **fiscally responsible** while at the same time providing **excellent service** and addressing the City Council's Strategic Priorities for **Infrastructure and Public Safety**.

Recommendation:

It is recommended City Council authorize the city manager to purchase thirteen (13) vehicles from approved vendors, for an amount not to exceed \$591,000.

Background/Analysis:

Since 1981, Fire Station 1 has proudly served as a home to City's Fire and Paramedic personnel. In the early 2000s, the facility was renovated into its current configuration and began also housing the Fire administration offices. However, over this past year, staff discovered parts of the original facility that need repair and modification to keep the facility proudly serving the Hurst community well into the future.

Staff, working in conjunction with specialized engineers, approved contractors, and reputable service companies, identified that the original sewer line has multiple leaks and needs total replacement. Additionally, the foundation in the administration offices and training room has several voids under the concrete slab; this will require corrective work, comprised of a process called "mud jacking" of approximately twenty yards of grout into the void space to relevel and stabilize the foundation. And finally, structurally modifying two bay door openings to allow for the addition of two vented bay doors will significantly aid in exhausting the equipment bays efficiently and function similarly to Fire Station 2.

Staff and the engineers worked closely with Falkenberg Construction Company, Inc., to coordinate the repair program and provide pricing for the proposed work. As a result, staff received a quote in the amount of \$236,321 (including a 10% contingency) for the repairs. The City of Hurst is a Choice Partners purchasing consortium member, which provides substantial cost savings for construction services from Falkenberg Construction Company, Inc. and allows the City to utilize them directly.

The timeline for the work may span several months due to material shortages and the scheduling of services.

Funding Sources and Community Sustainability:

Funding in the amount of \$236,321 is available within the Special Projects Fund.

This project addresses the City Council's Strategic Priorities for **Infrastructure and Public Safety** by maintaining safe operations at critical City facilities.

Recommendation:

It is recommended the City Council authorize the city manager to proceed with the Hurst Fire Station 1 Facility Repairs Project, for an amount not to exceed \$236,321, with Falkenberg Construction Company, Inc.

Background/Analysis:

The City utilizes the May uniform election date for the City's General Election of Officers. As part of the election process, the City Council must order the election, and historically, this is done prior to the beginning of the filing period for a place on the ballot.

The Main Early Voting location will be the Tarrant County Elections Center located at 2700 Premier Street, Fort Worth, Texas. There will be additional branch early voting locations throughout the County, as finalized in the Joint Agreement and Contract with the Tarrant County Elections Administrator.

Hurst residents may vote at any early Tarrant County polling location during the early voting by personal appearance process and on election day.

The proposed Resolution orders the election, authorizes a Joint Election Agreement and Contract for Election Services with the Tarrant County Elections Administrator, and establishes a date for a runoff election, if necessary.

Funding Sources and Community Sustainability:

Funding is provided in the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 budget. This item is representative of the Council's vision and mission statements along with their goals and priorities.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends the City Council approve Resolution 1831 calling the May 6, 2023 General Election of Officers.

- Section 1: **THAT** unless one or more of the entities qualify under provisions of the Texas Election Code to cancel their election, the City of Hurst shall hold a joint election, per the aforesaid Joint Election Agreement and Contract for election services, on Saturday, May 6, 2023, for the purpose of electing members of the Hurst City Council.
- Section 2: **THAT** an election is hereby ordered to elect persons to the offices of City Council Places 1, 2 and 6 to serve until May of 2025 or until their successors are duly elected and qualified. Such election shall be on the 6th day of May 2023, from 7:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m. The locations of polling locations for this election are designated pursuant to the aforesaid Joint Election Agreement and Contract for election services as those precincts designated by Tarrant County.
- Section 3: **THAT** qualified persons may file as candidates by filing application in the office of the City Secretary, Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. beginning on Wednesday, January 18, 2023, and continuing until 5:00 p.m. on Friday, February 17, 2023. The

names of eligible and qualified candidates for such office shall be placed on the ballot for such election by the City Secretary at the time and in the manner prescribed by law, and the charter and ordinances of the City of Hurst.

Background/Analysis:

There are two projects included in this proposed project. It involves two storm drain extensions with proposed curb inlets to pick up storm runoff prior to overloading the street capacity. One project location is on Highland Crest Drive at Steve Drive with the second project on Mary Drive at Keren Place.

Staff is recommending a contract with Birkhoff, Hendricks & Carter, LLP (BHC), to provide engineering plans and specifications for this storm drain project. Funding Sources and Community Sustainability:



THIS CONTRACT, By and between the **CITY OF HURST**, a municipal corporation located in Tarrant County, Texas, hereinafter called "City", and Birkhoff, Hendricks & Carter, LLP, a corporation authorized to do business in the State of Texas, hereinafter called "Engineer", evidences the following:

WHEREAS, City desires the professional services for

Design of storm sewer expansions along Mary Drive and Steve Drive.

WHEREAS, Engineer represents that it is qualified and capable of performing the professional services proposed herein for this Project and is willing to enter into this Contract with City to perform said services;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties in consideration of the terms and conditions contained herein agreed as follows:

Section 1. <u>EMPLOYMENT OF THE PROFESSIONAL</u>

Professional agrees to perform professional services in connection with the Project as set forth in the following sections of this Contract, and City agrees to pay, and Professional agrees to accept fees as set forth in the following sections as full and final compensation for all services provided under this Contract.

Section 2. CONTRACT ADMINISTRATION

This Contract shall be administered on behalf of the City by the Executive Director of Hurst Public Works or his designated representatives (hereinafter called "Director"), and on behalf of the Engineer by its duly authorized officials.

Section 3. ENGINEER'S SERVICES

The Engineer agrees to render services necessary for the development of the Project as outlined on Exhibit A.

Section 4. PAYMENT FOR SERVICES

A. Payment for services under Section 3 above will be lump sum, invoiced monthly based on percent complete.

expenses for supplies, transportation, equipment, travel, communication, subsistence and lodging away from home, and similar incidentals.

The Direct Non-Labor expenses shall be reimbursable at actual invoice cost plus 10%, except for living and travel expenses when away from the home office on business connected with the Project. All travel outside of the Dallas/Fort Worth Metropolitan Area to be made, which are reimbursable at actual invoice cost, by the Engineer in connection with the Project must first be approved in writing by the Director. The contract cost amount in Section 3 above shall include an estimate of the Direct Non-Labor expenses.

- C. Subcontractor cost shall be reimbursed at the actual invoice cost plus 10%. All expected subcontractor's cost shall be included in the contract cost amount shown in Section 3 above.
- D. Engineer shall submit itemized monthly statements for Services, Direct Non-Labor Expenses, and for Subcontractors Costs incurred. City shall make payments in the amount shown by the Engineer's monthly statements and other documentation submitted, and no interest shall ever be due on late payments.
- E. Payments for expenses, costs, and services, in **Preliminary Design**, described in Section 3 above, shall not exceed \$20,000.00.
- F. Payments for expenses, costs, and services, in **Final Design**, described in Section 3 above, shall not exceed \$6,750.00
- G. Payments for expenses, costs, and services, in **Construction Administration**, described in Section 3 above, shall not exceed \$6,000.00.
- H. Total project payments for direct non-labor expenses, Preliminary and Final Design, and Construction Administration, described in Section 3 above, shall not exceed \$32,750.00.
- I. Nothing contained in this contract shall require the City to pay for any work which is unsatisfactory as reasonably determined by the Director or which is not submitted in compliance with the terms of this Contract. City shall not be required to make any payments to the Engineer when the Engineer is in default under this Contract; nor shall this paragraph constitute a waiver of any right, at law or in equity, which City may have if the Engineer is in default, including the right to bring legal action for damages or for specific performance of this Contract, nor shall it constitute a waiver of any right, at law or in equity, which Engineer may have to bring legal action for payment when Engineer believes it was not under such default and is owed fees under the terms of this agreement.

Section 5. OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS

All information and other data given to, prepared, or assembled by Engineer under this Contract, and other related items shall become the sole property of City and shall be delivered to City, without restriction on future use. Engineer may make copies of any and all

documents and items for its files. A set of mylar reproducible plans shall be filed with the City prior to final payment. Engineer shall have no liability for changes made to or use of the drawings, specifications, and other documents by anyone subsequent to the completion of the Project.

City shall require that any such change or other use shall be sealed by the Engineer making that change or use and shall be appropriately marked to reflect what was changed or modified.

Section 6. <u>SERVICES BY CITY</u>

City shall provide the following services under this Contract:

- A. Provide available criteria and information to the Engineer as City's requirements for the Project.
- B. Provide sample drawings to use as guidelines.
- C. Provide all available City of Hurst drawings, maps, and notes relating to existing public facilities within the limits of the Project.

Section 7. COMPLETION SCHEDULE

The services furnished by the Engineer under this Contract will be completed in accordance with the following:

For the purposes of this Contract, a month is defined as thirty (30) calendar days and a week as seven (7) calendar days. If any of the following submissions fall on a City non-working day, then the submission shall be due the following City working day.

Section 8. NOTICE TO PROCEED

City shall have complete control of the services to be rendered and no work shall be done under this Contract until the Engineer is instructed in writing to proceed.

Section 9. TERMINATION OF CONTRACT

City may indefinitely suspend further work hereunder or terminate this Contract or any phase of this Contract upon thirty (30) days prior written notice to the Engineer with the understanding that immediately upon the receipt of such notice all work and labor being performed under this Contract shall cease immediately. Before the end of the thirty (30) day period, Engineer shall invoice the City for all work accomplished by him prior to the receipt

of such notice. No amount shall be due for lost or anticipated profits. All plans, field surveys, and other data related to the Project shall become property of City upon termination of the Contract and shall be promptly delivered to City in a reasonably organized form without restriction on future use except as stated in Section 5. Should City subsequently contract with a new consultant for continuation of services on the Project, Engineer shall cooperate in providing information.

Section 10. RESPONSIBILITY FOR CLAIMS AND LIABILITIES

Approval by City shall not constitute nor be deemed a release of the responsibility and liability of the Engineer, its employees, associates, agents, and consultants for the accuracy and competency of their designs or other work; nor shall approval be deemed to be an assumption of such responsibility by City for any errors or omissions in the design or other work prepared by the Engineer, its employees, subcontractor, agents and consultants.

Section 11. EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

- A. The Engineer shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, age, color, religion, sex, ancestry, national origin, or place of birth. The Engineer shall take affirmative action to insure that applicants are employed and that employees are treated during their employment without regard to their race, age, color, religion, sex, ancestry, national origin, or place of birth.
- B. If the Engineer fails to comply with the Federal Laws relating to Equal Employment Opportunity, it is agreed that the City at its option may do either or both of the following:
 - 1) Cancel, terminate, or suspend the contract in whole or in part;
 - 2) Declare the Engineer ineligible for further City Contracts until he is determined to be in compliance.

Section 12. AMENDMENTS

This Contract may be amended or supplemented in any particular only by written instrument and only as approved by resolution of City Council or the City Manager, except for termination under Section 9, <u>Termination of Contract</u>, which may be accomplished by the Director or his designated representative as identified in Section 9, <u>Termination of Contract</u>.

Section 13. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS, CHARTERS, AND ORDINANCES, ETC.

The Engineer, his consultants, agents and employees, and subcontractors shall comply with applicable Federal and State Laws, the Charter, and Ordinances of the City of Hurst, and with applicable rules and regulations promulgated by local, state, and national boards, bureaus, and agencies existing and published before date of this agreement.

Section 14. RIGHT OF REVIEW

Engineer agrees that City may review any and all of the work performed by Engineer under this Contract. City if hereby granted the right to audit at City's election, all of the Engineer's records and billings related to the performance of this contract. Engineer agrees to retain such records for a minimum of three (3) years following completion of this contract.

Section 15. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

No officer or employee shall have any financial interest, direct or indirect, in any contract with the City or be financially interested, directly, in the sale to the City of any land, materials, supplies, or services, except on behalf of the City as an officer or employee. Any violation of this section shall constitute malfeasance in office, and any officer or employee guilty thereof shall thereby forfeit his office or position with the City. Any violation of this section with knowledge, expressed or implied, of the person or corporation contracting with the City shall render the Contract involved voidable by the City Manager or the City Council.

Section 16. CONTRACT PERSONAL

This Contract is for personal and professional services; and the Engineer shall not assign this Contract, in whole or in part, without the prior written consent of the City.

Section 17. NOTICES

All notices, communications, and reports required or permitted under this Contract shall be personally delivered or mailed to the respective parties by depositing the same in the United States Mail at the address shown below unless and until either party is otherwise notified in writing by the other party at the following addresses. Mailed notices shall be deemed communicated after five days.

Section 18. <u>INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR</u>

In performing services under this Contract, Engineer is performing services of the type performed prior to this contract; and Engineer by the execution of this contract does not change the independent status of the Engineer. No term, or provision hereof, or act of Engineer in the performance of this Contract shall be construed as making Engineer the agent, servant, or employee of Hurst.

Section 19. INDEMNITY

Engineer agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold City whole and harmless against claims for damages, costs, and expenses of persons or property that may arise out of, or be occasioned by, or from any negligent act, error or omission of Engineer, or any agent, servant, or employee of Engineer in the execution or performance of this Contract, without regard to whether such persons are under the direction of City agents or employees.

This provision shall not be deemed to apply to liability for damage that is caused by or results from the negligence of the City of Hurst or its employees or other agents.

Section 20. INSURANCE

Engineer agrees to maintain workmen's compensation insurance to cover all of its own personnel engaged in performing services for client under this agreement. Engineer also agrees to maintain professional liability insurance and commercial general liability coverage in the amounts listed below:

Background/Analysis:


Significant erosion has taken place in the City's earthen channels over the past 10-20 years. One location of concern is the section of stream immediately downstream of the concrete pilot channel on Walker Branch (adjacent to the back of homes on Billy Creek Circle). Another location is on Lorean Branch just upstream of Cannon Drive beside Fire Station 1. The erosion is threatening to undermine the driveway into the fire station. The last location to be looked at, as part of this study, is on Sulphur Branch in Rickel Park where the stream makes almost a 90-degree bend. The erosion here is working its way toward the existing park sidewalk on the east side of the channel. All of these locations have extensive erosion. The study will investigate the cause and provide preliminary design options (not detail design) for the mitigation of these eroded locations. Based on this preliminary study and the Council's instructions, staff will bring back a proposed Engineering Service Agreement for final design of the bank stabilization improvements at these three locations.



THIS CONTRACT, By and between the **CITY OF HURST**, a municipal corporation located in Tarrant County, Texas, hereinafter called "City", and Halff Associates, Inc, a professional, hereinafter called "Professional", evidences the following:

WHEREAS, City desires the professional services for:

Development of an erosion capital improvement project plan along select reaches of Sulphur Branch, Walker Branch, and Lorean Branch based on a field inventory of the existing erosion and potential engineering design alternatives to address riverine erosion.

WHEREAS, Professional represents that it is qualified and capable of performing the professional services proposed herein and is willing to enter into this Contract with City to perform said services;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties in consideration of the terms and conditions contained herein agreed as follows:

1. EMPLOYMENT OF THE PROFESSIONAL

Professional agrees to perform professional services as set forth in the following sections of this Contract, and City agrees to pay, and Professional agrees to accept fees as set forth in the following sections as full and final compensation for all services provided under this Contract.

2. CONTRACT ADMINISTRATION

This Contract shall be administered on behalf of the City by the Executive Director of Public Works or his designated representatives (hereinafter called "Director"), and on behalf of the Professional by its duly authorized officials.

3. PROFESSIONAL'S SERVICES

The Professional agrees to render services necessary for the development of the Project as outlined on Exhibit A and B.

4. PAYMENT FOR SERVICES

A. Payment for services under Section 3 above will be lump sum, invoiced monthly based on percent complete.

- B. Total payments for direct non-labor expenses, costs, and professional services, described in Section 3 above, shall not exceed \$22,175.00
- C. Nothing contained in this article shall require City to pay for any work which is unsatisfactory as reasonably determined by the Director or which is not submitted in compliance with the terms of this Contract. City shall not be required to make any payments to the Professional when the Professional is in default under this Contract; nor shall this paragraph constitute a waiver of any right, at law or in equity, which City may have if the Professional is in default, including the right to bring legal action for damages or for specific performance of this Contract.

5. OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS

All information and other data given to, prepared, or assembled by Engineer under this Contract, and other related items shall become the sole property of City and shall be delivered to City, without restriction on future use. Professional may make copies of any and all documents and items for its files. A set of mylar reproducible plans shall be filed with the City prior to final payment. Professional shall have no liability for changes made to or use of the drawings, specifications, and other documents by anyone subsequent to the completion of the Project.

City shall require that any such change or other use shall be sealed by the Professional/Engineer making that change or use and shall be appropriately marked to reflect what was changed or modified.

6. SERVICES BY CITY

City shall provide the following services under this Contract:

- A. Provide available criteria and information to the Professional as City's requirements for each assignment related to the Contract.
- B. Provide all available City of Hurst drawings, maps, and notes relating to existing public facilities within the scope of each Contract assignment.
- C. Provide all subdivision ordinance material and related booklets/studies necessary for the proper review of proposed water, sanitary sewer, storm drainage, and paving facilities.

7. COMPLETION SCHEDULE

The completion schedule will be in accordance with the information shown in Exhibit C.

For the purposes of this Contract, a month is defined as thirty (30) calendar days and a week as seven (7) calendar days. If any of the following submissions fall on a City non-working day, then the submission shall be due the following City working day.

8. NOTICE TO PROCEED

City shall have complete control of the services to be rendered and no work shall be done under this Contract until the Professional is instructed in writing to proceed.

9. TERMINATION OF CONTRACT

City may indefinitely suspend further work hereunder or terminate this Contract or any phase of this Contract upon five (5) days prior written notice to the Professional with the understanding that immediately upon the receipt of such notice all work and labor being performed under this Contract shall cease immediately. Before the end of the five (5) day period, Professional shall invoice the City for all work accomplished by him prior to the receipt of such notice. No amount shall be due for lost or anticipated profits. All data related to the Contract shall become property of City upon termination of the Contract and shall be promptly delivered to City in a reasonably organized form without restriction on future use. Should City subsequently contract with a new consultant for continuation of services on the Contract, Professional shall cooperate in providing information.

10. RESPONSIBILITY FOR CLAIMS AND LIABILITIES

Project_Introduction

The City of Hurst has expressed a desire to develop an erosion capital improvement project plan along select reaches of Sulphur Branch, Walker Branch, and Lorean Branch as seen in Exhibit 1-A, 1-B, and 1-C, respectively. Halff will conduct a channel inventory of the existing erosion and develop potential alternatives to address erosion. This evaluation of alternatives will include recommended design development task summary, regulatory/permitting issues, approximate design/implementation cost, and benefit to the City of Hurst and property owners along the study streams.






