## QUALIFICATIONS

- Must be a United States citizen with a demonstrated good moral character.
- Must hold a FCC Amateur Radio License.

Staff will provide training as needed.

## RESPONSIBILITIES

- Provide information to the Emergency Manager and other partners during severe weather and other events as necessary, utilizing amateur radio procedures.
- Assist in conducting monthly siren testing.
- Offer additional community services as requested.
- Provide training and testing for individuals interested in becoming a radio operator.

## REQUIREMENTS

- Open to all ages.
- Time commitment: Flexible according to personal schedules.
- No criminal record.
- Training
  - SKYWARN training every 2 years.
  - FEMA Courses IS-100c Introduction to Incident Command.
  - IS-700B National Incident Management System.
  - IS-2200 Basic Emergency Operations Center Functions.
  - Ongoing education and training opportunities are available.
- Physical demands
  - Must be able to drive, sit, walk, talk, hear, see, and stand.
- Mental demands
  - Read, speak, and write clearly.
  - Comprehend, retain, and follow oral and written instructions.
  - Effectively communicate.
- Work environment
  - Volunteer may work outside and be exposed to varying weather conditions. Volunteer will have interaction with the public.
